Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the Summer Term 2022 at Torriano. For the summer term, we continue our whole school theme, The Art of Explanation. We kicked off the term by celebrating Earth Day on Friday, encouraging the children to consider innovative ways to help combat climate change and develop our relationship with nature. We will also be taking part in a whole school project called The World Reimagined.

All children will use their science learning to further develop their investigative skills with our Scientist in Residence Dr Lucy Collinson from the CRICK Institute. Other exciting partnerships will really bring the children's learning to life and include The University of Westminster, Camden Beeline, Shakespeare Birthplace Trust and Creative Collaborative. We will also be celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee at the end of this half term.

The attached curriculum leaflet gives you an overview of the learning that will be taking place this term in your child's year group. Through our tectonics topic the children will be learning about earthquakes, mountains and volcanoes. Our focus in the second half of the term will be on the rise and fall of the Kingdom of Benin.

All classes will use Torriano Timelines and Knowledge Quarters to support children to learn, remember and recall key facts about Tectonics and the Kingdom of Benin.

This term we are going to the Natural History Museum, to explore their Earthquakes exhibition. We will also discover the Benin bronzes at the British Museum.






## Attendance and Punctuality



Attendance at school is essential for all children, to support their academic development and wellbeing. We continue to work towards our attendance target of 97%. We appreciate the challenges that Covid presents and take this into account for children's attendance. ## Home Learning

 Google Classroom Homework	<p>Homework at Torriano will continue to be given through Google Classroom. Homework books are available if children prefer to do their homework in this way but we would encourage the use of Google Classroom. Homework is set on a Wednesday and should be returned on Monday online or in books. As part of our focus group we will be looking at different ways to do homework in Year 3 this term, your support and feedback with these changes is appreciated.</p>
Reading 	<p>Parental and guardian support is hugely important for developing reading skills, confidence and understanding. Even if children are independent readers, we still encourage parents to read with them or listen to them and discuss the books they are reading.</p> <p>Children need to read at home for at least 15 minutes a day and complete a short daily reflection in their reading records ('I enjoyed this book because...' 'It was funny when...' or alternatively an adult can write the comment for them). Reading records will be marked by an adult twice weekly (on a Monday and Thursday). Children's reading records and current reading book should be brought to school every day as they are sometimes used, and referred to, in lessons. We will be trialling a new reading record and the children have been practising using this at school. Please ask us if you have queries about this,</p>
Wanda's Spelling Bee 	<p>Every week your child will take part in <i>Wanda's Spelling Bee</i>. A spelling sound, rule or pattern will be taught in class each week on a Tuesday. Your child will then be given a list of words that follow that sound, rule or pattern to learn. Spellings will be sent home in their home learning book and published on the Google Classroom.</p> <p>The following week, your child will be tested on their words that follow that sound, rule or pattern. The aim is for the children to apply their understanding of the spelling conventions, helping them to become successful spellers. There will be suggested activities for your child to do to demonstrate that they have been learning their spellings. The teacher will check their spelling each week to see if they have completed an activity.</p>



<p>Fluency in maths</p> 	<p>Knowing number facts is an important tool to enable your child to feel confident in maths. Revising number facts, including times tables, is an easy way to support your child's progress in mathematics and we encourage children to revise them regularly. Through their weekly homework, children will be given strategies and activities to support them. Children will also be encouraged to log in into online maths resources such as Hegarty Maths, Doodle Maths or Timestable Rockstars. Their login details for specific website resources will be sent home. MOT Certificates are awarded to children in Celebration Assemblies when they have successfully mastered the number facts relevant to their learning and personal targets (e.g. times tables).</p>
<p>New words</p> <p>Ask me what this means...</p> 	<p>Direct vocabulary teaching of new words linked to the learning takes place every day. On a Friday, children choose one of their new words to wear on a sticker and discuss its meaning with their friends and the adults they meet. We encourage you to speak to your child about their chosen word each week. This will help them to deepen their understanding of the new vocabulary and to develop their oracy skills.</p>

Homework, reading books and reading records should be kept in a book bag as these are used/referred to regularly in class.

## PE

PE will take place every Wednesday and Friday. Children will not be changing for PE so please ensure they wear appropriate clothes for physical activity on these days, including trainers. Please note, we have and will continue to do a Daily Mile, so it is important that children wear appropriate footwear daily.

We look forward to an exciting year and are available at pickup to discuss any queries at the end of each school day.
