Sustainable Development Goal 9 'Industry Innovation and Infrastructure' calls for rapid change to develop sustainable transport in order to meet SDG 13 Climate Action.

Through a lens of the past, present and future, the children will explore our question through developing their knowledge and skills in Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics. On this journey, our children will be developing the attributes of a STEAM - ready young person, as pledged in the Camden STEAM Education Strategy 2022-25. Through relevant and purposeful partnerships, the children will access the wealth of Camden STEAM industries, working with local employers and educational institutions to explore the questions and issues raised by 'Are We Nearly there Yet?'

Attendance



Being in school is vital for children's education and for their wellbeing. All children are expected to attend school every day unless they are unwell. This year so far our attendance has been 92.4%, significantly below our 97% attendance target. School attendance is mandatory. Please be aware that:

- It is a parent/carer's duty to ensure that their child attends school
- It is the schools' responsibility to record attendance and follow up absence
- Schools and local authorities may issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices in line with local authorities' codes of conduct if a child is absent from school.

With the summer months and warmer weather we hope that there is less illness in order to ensure the best possible attendance at school.

Punctuality

We saw a real improvement in punctuality in the Spring Term - please keep this up in the Summer Term! Please note, if your child arrives after 9am they will be marked as late and need to report to the front office. Please support your child to be ready for school with their books and bags, ready to encourage a prompt morning routine. Children arriving late to school miss vital learning and school routines which can create anxiety as children arrive unsettled. If you find arriving at school on time challenging, please speak with staff and find solutions together. We look forward to helping establish positive learning routines and improving attendance this year.
