- Use a timeline to place important events.

## Key Learning

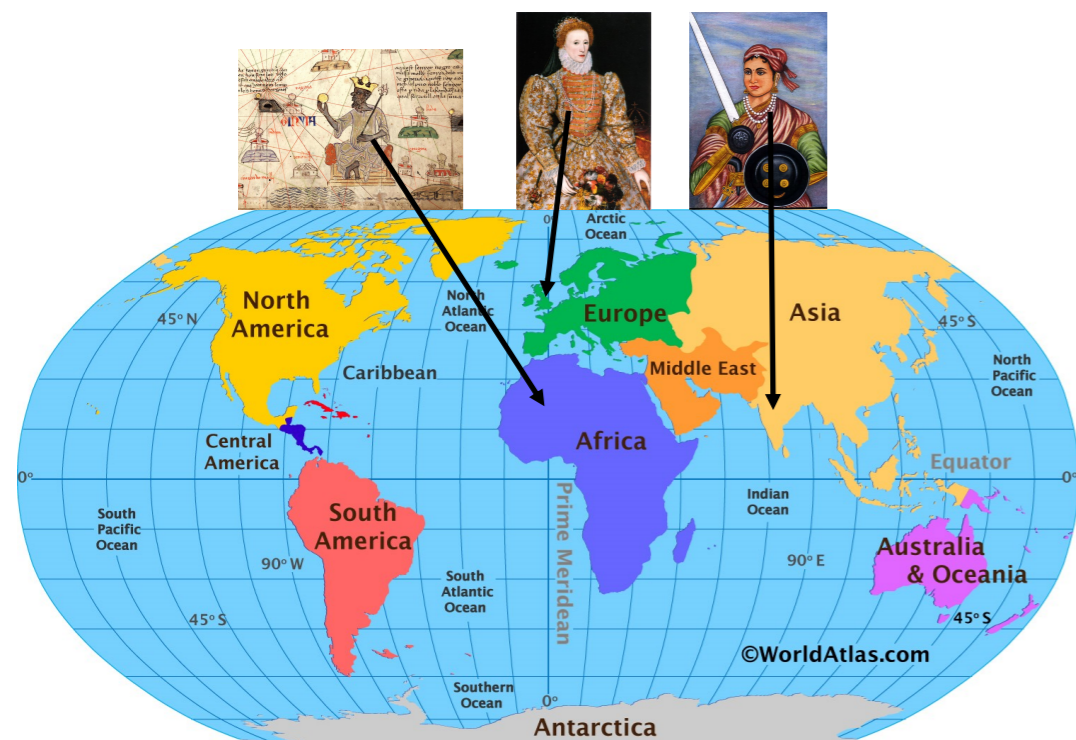
- Queen Elizabeth I, Mansa Musa and Rhani of Jhansi were three very different monarchs, but also had some similarities.
- All three were able to make changes and influence the people in their country.
- Lakshimbai wanted to defend her people, Queen Elizabeth wanted to take over different countries and Mansa Musa wanted to spread the word about his empire and riches.
- The job of the British monarch King Charles III is very different to the three other monarchs studied in the past.
